The scientific evidence will also have a place in these documentaries. Several of the issues raised will be contrasted by renowned scientific experts in the area.

It is estimated that climate warming caused by greenhouse gases, released by human activities, will mean an increase in the average temperature of our planet of approximately 3°C by the end of this century.

This increase will generate a sea level rise of between 30 and 50 centimeters due to the melting of the polar ice caps. And as the ice diminishes in these areas, not only its rich natural resources disappear but also its own inhabitants.

These ethnic groups are seeing their inhabited territory altered, their ethnic diversity and their own living conditions. Many times they are displaced and their younger population migrate to cities where the living conditions are less hostile.

The disconnection of these communities with their original territory by geographical dispersion is equivalent to a progressive loss of their culture and identity. It is clear that the future of the polar bear is uncertain, but so is that of these indigenous peoples.

Beyond the environmental policies existing in the world, through the images of these documentaries we want to make a call to our collective conscience and our responsibility as inhabitants of this planet. Each and every one of us can make our contribution to the environment. Because many few do a LOT and because we are still in time to act. Are you up for it?

HOW CAN YOU COLLABORATE?


